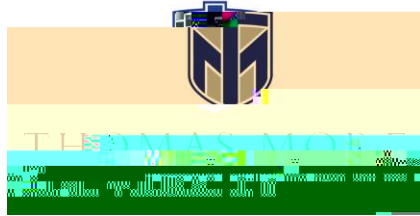


Computer Information Systems Dual-Credit Pathway
